## Troubled urban development

- Due to the crisis the public sector has lost the steering role in urban development, both in power and in money.
- Urban development is dominated by private interests, there are dead areas in the city, people are inactive, not thinking at all what could be done differently.
- New ways have to be found how the public sector can again steer the development, for the sake of public interests.

## New ways to steer local development

- Instead of sitting in the office and writing reports new types of tools have to be used to involve stakeholders which are not reacting any more to traditional tools of planning (e.g. master plans).
- More flexible approaches are needed to assure integrated and inclusive development, based on opportunities given by underused spaces and by people who can be involved.
- Inspirational ideas can be gathered from URBACT networks and the URBACT guide to innovative urban development cases.

## **URBACT** project: Sub-urban


Re-making a densely built-in transitory part of the city, to avoid further densification of the historical part: Antwerp, Lageweg. Big challenges: privately owned (10 private owners), polluted areas... Jumping between topics: spatial idea, financing, legal issues...





## **URBACT** project: Refill

Create new empty places in the city as opportunity/space for experimentation about future activities: creative district, lie de Nantes.







# **URBACT** project: 2nd Chance

Use an empty building to start the change in a monofunctional part of the city: Brussels, European quarter.





### The online web-tool


The tool includes **good practices of URBACT cities** in a logical order, illustrating innovative planning and city making examples according to two aspects:
